- Beautiful Wadis, the fog forests of Dhofar, the baking sand desert, unique Juniper forests and the salty Sabka.
- Guests will explore 2 giant biome enclosures, recreating unique climates, ride on land trains and discover age old Omani traditions and skills, buy plants, enjoy fine foods.

Progress to date.

- Substantial nursery established.
- Pioneering propagation
- Over 300,000 plants, many in advanced stages
- Large scale salvaging undertaken
- Seed bank and herbarium established.
- Final designs complete and tenders for construction to be let early new year.

Challenges

- No horticulture industry
- Inexperienced staff
- Centralised fiscal control
- Searing heat for ¾ of the year
- Low rainfall (Last rain Muscat Feb 2014)
- Water, water, water.
- Cultural observances
